Preamble

WHEREAS, STC and NLT have many areas of common interest in foreign language training and assessment considerable advantage may be gained from their pursuit on a collaborative basis in the fields of academics and education.

NOW THEREFORE, STC and NLT have decided to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as MoU), which defines the framework for the cooperation of the two institutions set out in the following sections.

Objective

Both Institutes agree to develop the following collaborative activities in the academic areas of mutual interest, on a basis of equality and reciprocity.

The two institutions shall seek to promote Faculty/trainers and Staff Exchanges

- Be a knowledge partner for different programs
- Collaboration in teaching and consultancy in the field of mutual interest,
- The exchange of academic materials and publications,
- Conducting lectures and orientations
- Attachment of staff for purposes of curriculum development and marketing

A specific plan will be worked out for each activity; setting forth detailed arrangements for collaboration will be agreed. Terms and conditions for each visit or an assignment will be worked out between the institutes.

Areas of Collaboration

- to conduct IELTS training and exam preparation
- sharing knowledge content, learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and training programs,
- to jointly organize orientation programs on different foreign languages
- Inviting candidates for foreign language programs,

STC and NLT agree that detailed terms and conditions that guide each activity identified above will be determined separately and agreed upon by the two institutions. These terms shall include a technical description of the proposed activity, financial arrangements, and person(s) responsible for its implementation.

Coordination

Each institution shall appoint one member of its teaching/research faculty to coordinate the programme on its behalf. Further, a coordination committee consisting of a programme coordinator from the side of NLT, and a programme coordinator from the side of STC, will periodically review and identify ways to strengthen cooperation between the two institutions.

Ownership of any intellectual property (including but not limited to confidential information, know-how, patents, copyrights, design rights, rights relating to computer software, and any other industrial or intellectual property rights) developed jointly during the course of this MOU shall be vested in both institutes to this Memorandum.

Validity

The Memorandum shall remain in force for a period of Two years commencing from effective date. Institutions may extend the term by written agreement signed by both after review. Either institution may terminate the MoU by giving written notice of Three months in advance to the other institution. Once terminated, neither STC and NLT will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer. However, STC and NLT will ensure that the provisions of this Memorandum shall continue to apply to all activities in progress until their completion.

This MoU may be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives of both institutes. Participating faculties, staff and students involved in any activities under this Memorandum must adhere to the law of the host countries and rules and regulations of the institutions. Nothing in this Memorandum shall be construed as creating any legal relationship between the institutes. This Memorandum is a statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration. In case, there be a dispute relating to any aspect of academic cooperation, Principal, STC and NLT will jointly resolve the dispute in a spirit of independence, mutual respect, and shared responsibility.

STC and NLT welcome the establishment of this Memorandum for cooperation and jointly agree to the provisions as set out above.

Financial Arrangements

- 1. The financial obligation is based on win-win policy. Both institutions share equally monetary benefits based on the number of admissions to each batch.
- 2. For 10+ students, share 10% of the course fees excluding GST
- 3. For 20+ Students, share 20% of the course fees excluding GST
- 4. Next Level will train IELTS students of St. Thomas College and supply students to various foreign language courses.
- 5. Classes will be done in respective institutions; IELTS at The Next Level and Foreign Languages at STC.

C. The Parties are desirous of entering into this MoU to declare their respective intentions and to establish a basis of co-operation and collaboration between the Parties upon the terms as contained herein.

JMMC & RI AND STCT HAVE REACHED AN UNDERSTANDING AS FOLLOWS:

1. OBJECTIVE

The Parties, subject to the terms of this MoU and the laws, rules, regulations and national policies from time to time in force in each party's country, will endeavor to strengthen, promote and develop cooperation between the Parties on the basis of equality and mutual benefit.

2. AREAS OF CO-OPERATION

- 2.1 Each Party will, subject to the laws, rules, regulations and national policies from time to time in force, governing the subject matter, endeavor to take the necessary steps to encourage and promote co-operation in the following areas:
 - a) Transfer of fund by STCT on behalf of Department of Commerce (self finance) to JMMC & RI for helping eligible cancer patients
 - b) Collaboration for conducting at least one Medical Camp/Social Extension Activities in an academic year.
 - c) Availing of Resource Persons from JMMC&RI
 - d) Jointly organize international conferences; and
 - e) any other areas of co-operation to be mutually agreed upon by the Parties from time to time.
- 2.2 For the purpose of implementing the co-operation in respect of any area in sub-clause 2.1 the Parties may enter into a legally binding agreement subject to terms and conditions as mutually agreed upon by the Parties.

3. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

- 3.1 This MoU will not give rise to any financial obligation by one Party to the other.
- 3.2 The fund collected using coupons, by the students will be used for helping eligible cancer patients of Jubilee Mission Hospital Thrissur. Department will not be under any other financial obligation to the hospital.
- 3.3 The event will be organized only once in an year.
- 3.4 Department of commerce (self finance) STCT is not be liable for the transferring of fund. in any case, if there is a difficulty in fund collection through coupons.
- 3.5 Each party will bear its own cost and expenses in the implementation of this MoU.

· 4. CONFIDENTIALITY

4.1 Each Party shall undertake to observe the secrecy of confidential information received from or supplied to the other Parties during the period of implementation of this MoU or other agreements made pursuant to this MoU.

For purposes of this MoU, "confidential information" means any information whether prior to or hereinafter disclosed by a Party (the Disclosing Party) to the other Parties (the Receiving Party) of this MoU involving technical, business, marketing, policy, knowhow, planning, project management

not limited to any information which is designated in writing to be confidential or by its nature intended to be for the knowledge of the Receiving Party or if orally given, is given in the circumstances of confidence.

4.3 All Parties agree that the provisions of this Clause shall continue to be binding between the Parties notwithstanding the termination of this MoU.

5. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- 5.1 The intellectual property rights shall be enforced in conformity with the respective national laws, rules and regulations of the Parties and with other international agreements signed by both Parties.
- 5.2 The use of the name, logo and/or official emblem of any of the Parties on any publication, document and/or paper is prohibited without the prior written approval of either Party.
- 5.3 Notwithstanding anything in sub-clause 5.1 above, the intellectual property rights in respect of any technological development, and any products and services development, carried out
 - 5.3.1 jointly by the Parties or research results obtained through the joint activity effort of the Parties, shall be jointly owned by the Parties in accordance with the terms to be mutually agreed upon; and
- **6.** solely and separately by the Party or the research results obtained through the sole and separate effort of the Party, shall be solely owed by the Party concerned.

EFFECT OF MoU

This MoU serves only as a record of the Parties' intentions and does not constitute, and is not intended to constitute or create, obligations under domestic or international law and will not give rise to any legal process and will not be deemed to constitute or create any legally binding or enforceable obligations, express or implied.

7. NO AGENCY

Nothing contained herein shall be construed so as to constitute a joint venture partnership or formal business organization of any kind between the Parties or so to constitute either Party as the agent of the other.

8. ENTRY INTO EFFECT AND DURATION

- 8.1 This MoU will come into effect on the date of signing and will remain in effect for a period of one (1) year.
- 8.2 This MoU may be extended for a further period as may be agreed in writing by the Parties.

9. REVISION, VARIATION, AMENDMENT AND TERMINATION

- 9.1 Any Party may request in writing a revision, variation or amendment of this MoU.
- 9.2 Any such revision, variation or amendment agreed to by the Parties shall be in writing and shall form part of this MoU.
- 9.3 Such revision, variation or amendment shall come into force on such date as may be determined by the Parties.
- 9.4 Any party may terminate this MoU by giving six (6) months advance notice in writing to the other party.

9.5 Any revision, variation, amendment, termination or expiration shall not prejudice the implementation of any project, activity or cooperation arising from or based on this MoU before or up to the date of such revision, variation or amendment.

10. SUPERVENING EVENTS

- 10.1.1 Each Party reserves the right for reasons of national security, national interests, public order or public health to suspend temporarily, either in whole or in part, the implementation of this MoU which suspension shall take effect immediately after notification has been given to the other Party.
- 10.1.2 Notwithstanding sub-clause 9.1, should any other event occur which hinders or restricts the implementation of this MoU, the parties shall use their best endeavor to agree upon such action, as may be necessary and equitable, to remove the cause of such event.

11. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

Any difference or disputes between the Parties concerning the interpretation and/or implementation and/or application of any of the provisions of this MoU shall be settled amicably through mutual consultation and/or negotiations between the Parties without reference to any third party or international tribunal.

12. COMPETENT AUTHORITIES

The authorities responsible for the fulfillment of this MoU are the Director of JMMC& RI and the Principal of STCT.

- 2. Candidates should have CEFR C1 language level (IELTS Band 7 or equivalent) to be accepted for the CERTTESOL course. CILA will conduct an interview and assess their written and spoken English before accepting a candidate for the TESOL course.
- 3. SIIFL can either refer a candidate directly to CILA by sending their names and contact numbers to the concerned people at CILA or ask the candidates to fill in the TESOL application form on the CILA's website and enter a unique reference keyword SIIFL Thrissur under the question, "How did you hear about us?"

Student Exchange

TASC and STC agree that student exchange will be guided by principles listed below. A home institution refers to the institution where a student is a full-time student, and from where he/she is expected to graduate. A host institution refers to an institution that receives a student for a brief period of time to undertake a pre-determined programme of study or research.

- Exchange students will be selected by mutual agreement between the home institution and the
- His/her programme/course of study at the host institution will be determined by mutual consultation between his/her academic advisor at the home institution and his/her "interim" academic advisor identified by the host institution.
- The host institution will evaluate an exchange student's performance in each course or module, award a letter grade or marks, and issue a letter to that effect.

- If an exchange student has undertaken research, then the host institution will evaluate the exchange student's performance in the research, and issue a letter to that effect, together with a technical "report" of the research carried out.
- If an exchange student has undertaken research, then the home institution will take note of the
 performance evaluation and the technical report, and take steps in accordance with its own
 procedures.
- The exchange students will pay tuition and other fees at their home institution.

Ownership of any intellectual property (including but not limited to confidential information, know-how, patents, copyrights, design rights, rights relating to computer software, and any other industrial or intellectual property rights) developed jointly during the course of this MOU shall be vested in both institutes to this Memorandum.

Validity

The Memorandum shall remain in force for a period of Two years commencing from effective date. Institutions may extend the term by written agreement signed by both after review. Either institution may terminate the MoU by giving written notice of Three months in advance to the other institution. Once terminated, neither TASC nor STC will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer.
